From the Principals Desk...

Everyone will have or should have received their Board of Trustees election voting papers. Please do take the time to read over these election documents and please do have your say. We have 6 outstanding candidates and it would empower your next School Board of Trustees to know that we had strong community voice in the elections. Your voting papers can be dropped into the school office.

I also want to share an incredibly powerful picture with you. Currently there is a large concern based on attendance to school Nationally. There are many reasons for the drop in attendance Nationally and in some cases these may be justified. However, I am super proud to show that our analysed Term 1 attendance data is significantly higher than many National comparison cohorts. (The diamond is St John Bosco. The dark grey decile 8 schools like us, the dark blue is the Taranaki / Whanganui / Manawatu district, the light blue co-ed schools and the line All schools in New Zealand). The winners here will be our children. Although there has been significant disruption, regular attendance and structured or focussed learning has been able to continue at St John Bosco School.



Friday 9th September, Kia Ora Whanau, Welcome back to cross country season! We are very excited to be able to have parents on site with us this year to support our tamariki in this event. The date has been set for Friday 9th September. Like all other years, our main focus is 100% participation. Our focus is to see every child cross the line with a great big smile saying "I did the cross country in 2022!" We are encouraging

children to wear their house colours or comfortable running gear to school for the day (If you are unsure of your child's house and their colour please ask their class teacher). They will also need to bring a water bottle, a full lunch box, a towel and spare change of clothes just in case they happen to get caught in a rain shower. Please make sure all items of clothing are clearly named. Thank you. They may come to school in their running attire for the day.

I am sure that we will have an influx of parents with us and viewing space will be at a premium. Please be weary of where you stand to spectate as the course makes full use of the school grounds. Standing on the senior and junior playgrounds is often the best viewing position.

We will also be asking that the children stay in class with their teachers until they have run. This is so we know where they are and will not miss their race. Your children are more than welcome to join you after their event. The teachers may bring their classes out to watch some races. If this is the case you may join your child's group.

Message from the NZ Catholic Bishops. - September: SEASON OF CREATION

Pope Francis established 1 September as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, asking the Catholic community around the world to pray for our common home.



He calls us all to celebrate this opportune moment to "reaffirm [our] personal vocation to be stewards

of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore God's help for the protection of creation, as well as God's pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live." The symbol chosen for this year is the **burning bush**, which contrasts the fire of so many unnatural fires that aggravate the climate crisis; with the sign of fire as the light of the Holy Spirit that unites Christians. In this Season of Creation, this symbol of God's spirit calls us to listen to the voice of creation.

The National Liturgy Office has posted online resources to help liturgy groups prepare for the Season of Creation from 1 September to 4 October. Parishes, schools and households are invited to participate in a variety of ways to renew our relationship with our Creator God and all of Creation through celebration, conversion and commitment together.

A message from the NZ Catholic Bishops - Synod

Parishes and dioceses around the country took part in the local phase of Pope Francis's synodal path to the Church's future, which will culminate in an Assembly of the Synod of Bishops in Rome in October next year. The NZ bishops have just published the National Synod synthesis document that emerged from the diocesan phase of the process and the national hui held in Wellington in June. The national document has been sent to Rome as one of the many such documents from around the Catholic world as part of the Synod process.
