SJB CROSS COUNTRY - Like all other years, our main focus is 100% participation. Our focus is to see every child cross the line with a great big smile saying "I did the cross country in 2022!"

Children will be permitted to wear their house colours (Green Rewarewa, Yellow Barbier, Red Darnell and Blue Waiwhakaiho) or comfortable running gear to school for the day. They will also need to bring a water bottle, a full lunch box, a towel and spare change of clothes (including underwear) just in case they happen to get caught in a rain shower. Please make sure all items of clothing are clearly named. Thank

you. They may come to school in their running attire for the day.

I am sure that we will have an influx of parents with us and viewing space will be at a premium. Please be weary of where you stand to spectate as the course makes full use of the school grounds. Standing on the senior and junior playgrounds is often the best viewing position.

We will also be asking that the children stay in class with their teachers until they have run. This is so we know where they are and will not miss their race. Your children are more than welcome to join you after their event. The teachers may bring their classes out to watch some races. If this is the case you may join your child's group, but please don't move them to another part of the school.

Social Justice Week 2022 runs from September 4-10 and focuses on the topic of racism. The theme this year is



The mosaic that is formed in the poster is the kowhaiwhai pattern that symbolises movement and change. Found also in the Caritas Aotearoa New Zealand logo, it continually points us in new directions as we face the challenges of our complex, globalised world, grappling with issues such as racism.

In the name of the One who came to proclaim good news to all creation, Jesus Christ. Amen.






