
I believe in one God

Catholic here means universal and apostolic means from the apostles.





The church is now in the season of Ordinary time.

Ordinary Time is the longest season in the Church's year. It is thirty-three weeks and divided into two sections; one short and the other very long. Ordinary Time in our liturgical calendar distinguishes it from the other seasons—Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. Ordinary Time celebrates Jesus' teaching and ministry and is a time to reflect on how we live as disciples of Jesus following his teachings. GREEN, the colour of Ordinary

Time, It is the rich colour of growth and new life. Ordinary Time contains the essence of who we are as everyday Catholics.

The feast of Corpus Christ or The Body and Blood of Christ is this Sunday. This is the Holy Day to remember the Sacrament of the Eucharist or Holy Communion. Many Parishes have children making their First Communion on this day. Let's pray for them as they journey to becoming full and active members of our Catholic community.
