

The Transfiguration of the Lord

The Feast of the Transfiguration (August 6) recalls and celebrates Jesus' revelation of his divinity to three of his friends—Peter, James, and John—on a high point on Mount Tabor. According to the Gospel accounts, Jesus took the three disciples onto the mountain to pray. While they were praying, his appearance was changed by a brilliant white light that radiated from him and his clothing. Moses and Elijah, the greatest prophets of the Old Testament, appeared with Jesus, and a voice came from heaven, saying, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him."

The Assumption of Mary (15th August)

What is a Holy Day of obligation?

The obligation to participate in the Mass. The obligation to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the time with God. In New Zealand, we now have only two holy days of obligations as well as Sundays. They are Christmas Day and the feast of the Assumption, August 15. This day celebrates the mystery that the Virgin Mary was taken into heaven body and soul. Mary's assumption into heaven is also the patronal feast of the Catholic people in New Zealand. In other words, she is the Patron saint of New Zealand and this week is her feast day.


