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SJB CROSS COUNTRY - Tuesday 29th August 2023

Like all other years, our main focus is 100% participation. Our focus is to see every child cross the line with a great big smile saying "I did the cross country in 2023!"

Children will be permitted to wear their <u>house</u> colours as this makes allocating house points for participation much easier. Rewarewa (green), Darnell (red), Barbier (yellow) and Waiwhakaiho (blue). Please be mindful that it's a sporting event, so athletic/sporty/bike pant style shorts and a t-shirt are the most appropriate.

We are sure that we will have an influx of parents with us and viewing space will be at a premium. Please be aware of where you stand to spectate as the course makes full use of the school grounds. Standing on the senior and junior playgrounds is often the best viewing position.

We will also be asking that the children stay in class with their teachers until they have run. This is so we know where they are and so they will not miss their race. Your children are more than welcome to join you after their event. The teachers may bring their classes out to watch some races. If this is the case you may join your child's group, but please don't move them to another part of the school.

The day will look like ...

- At the end of each race, the top five runners will be given a number on their hand and are to go to the gazebo to record their names. Top three get a photo taken.
- The New Plymouth Cross Country is on Friday the 8th September, with the location to be confirmed.
- Teachers will, from the top five runners for the 9, 10 & 11 year races, consider who might go to these competitions. We sometimes select our top 8 year old runners to run in the 9 year old race.
- Unfortunately the Taranaki Cross Country Champs date clashes with our school production this year. There will be a case by case discussion around attending this (depending on production involvement).
- Please keep an 'eye' on the school Facebook page for communication on the day. We will try to load photos of each age group and keep you posted on results throughout the day.
- There is a postponement day, Thursday the 31st August, however this will only be used if Tuesday's weather is torrential and unsafe for the children. In the past we have still run the races on days when the forecast is for showers. Cross country is a winter sport, therefore rain is part of the experience and the children come prepared to get wet and have spare clothes.

The importance of prayer......

Jesus taught us to pray. St Luke tells us that Jesus prayed always. Jesus prayed before his choice of the 12 Apostles. He prayed in the synagogue and temple. He prayed in the desert and the garden. He prayed for long periods of time and for short moments in time. The Gospels rarely describe what his prayer was like, simply noting that he prayed often. Make time for personal prayer. Make time to pray with your family. Take a look at the website Pray as you go. You can download the app too! It's great!

The Lord's Prayer: The Apostles were so moved by the depth of Jesus' prayer life that they asked him to help them to pray: "Lord, teach us to pray" (Luke 11:1). Jesus responded with what is now known as the Lord's Prayer. "The Lord's Prayer is the most perfect of prayers...In it we ask, not only for all the things we rightly desire, but also in the sequence that they should be desired." (CCC, 276). It is at heart an individual and a community prayer (CCC, 2776) Pray it often!




August 22 The Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The feast of the Queenship of Mary was started in 1954 by Pope Pius XII, but the tradition of celebrating Mary as queen of heaven goes back much earlier. The Church leaders often referred to Mary as "lady" and "queen" as early as the fourth century. The basic concept is that if Jesus is "king," then it is fitting that Mary, his mother, would share in his reign as queen. You may know the beautiful hymn "Hail Queen of Heaven". We sing it at Mass on the Feast of the Assumption of Mary.

August 24 St Bartholomew (Apostle)

St Bartholomew was one of the twelve apostles. He taught all about Jesus in India and Western Asia in the very early years of Christianity. He was a great missionary for Jesus who travelled far and wide.
