#### October - The month of the Rosary

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. It is based on incidents in the life of Jesus and Mary. The use of beads or knotted ropes to count large numbers of prayers comes from the earliest days of Christianity. However, this way of prayer precedes Christianity. The development of the rosary as we know it today has gone through many stages. Christian Monks used this method to pray the Psalms. Today the rosary consists of in total 150 Hail Marys. divided into three sets of 50, which are further divided into five sets of 10 (a decade). Many people pray 1 set.

#### The rosary tells the story of Jesus' life in four parts:

The Joyful Mysteries - tell us about Jesus' birth and his early life

The Sorrowful Mysteries - teach us about the suffering and death of Jesus on the cross

The Glorious Mysteries - are about Jesus' resurrection and the glorious life that awaits us in heaven The Luminous Mysteries - tell about Jesus' ministry when he went out to teach people about God.

Catholics have been given a very special gift in the rosary. This year we will be praying the Rosary (Joyful, Glorious and Luminous Mysteries) during October. You may also like to make the Rosary part of your prayer time at home this month.
