From the Principals Desk...

Kia ora koutou

Last Friday we recognised Parihaka, the peaceful resistance led by Tohu and Te Whiti and the many shared beliefs we hold between ourselves at St John Bosco and their movement of peace. The day involved children working with their house groups in a tuakana/teina style in a range of activities including planting seedlings, making soup together and a kapa haka competition won by Rewarewa house!

Our Year 6 students have just returned from camp at Vertical Horizons. We are so fortunate to have this facility so close to us. The zip line, kayaking, flying kiwi, catwalk and more alongside trained facilitators make it the perfect spot for our annual Year 6 Camp. Many thanks to our parent volunteers for the time, effort and fun attitudes they bring. And, of course, to Mrs Young and Mr Page for the huge amount of organisation that goes in prior and the big shift they do while at camp. There were some tired people rolling into school at 2pm and all accounts suggest our children did us proud with how they got along, challenged themselves and with their overall conduct. Well done Year 6.

The Turf is nearly complete with sand being dropped today. It has been a fascinating process to observe over the past week as the main blocks of colour are rolled out, joined together and then glued only at the edges and the joins. Once this was in place the workers cut out the court markings and lay the coloured lines (white and yellow lines) in the empty space. The final element today was laying the sand. This helps to weigh the turf down and keep it from shifting or lifting. There are 4 square boxes being laid at some stage next week and then it should all be fully operational.



Parking: Time for that termly reminder about parking. Poor Andrea's ears are ringing from the neighbours complaints about parking on yellow lines and on grass berms etc. I know it is difficult to get parking at such a busy time but it is of paramount importance that we place the safety of children at the forefront of any decisions we make around and outside our school.

On that note, our next batch of road patrollers were trained by our community constables Brett and Gary. The kea crossing on Paynters Ave is a great service for our community and a great real life, authentic leadership opportunity for our Year 6 students.

We have had excellent results in the ICAS and Canterbury exams for 2023. We must thank Inthira for all the work she does coordinating this. Congratulations to Pippa (Science), Lucca (English), Ben (Spelling) and Max (Maths) in particular for receiving Principal's awards for their achievements.



Finally some dates for next week: Wednesday is the community group meeting at 7pm, Thursday is our whanau hui at school starting at 6pm (pizza supplied!) while Friday is a Teacher Only Day to enable staff to undertake the necessary learning to engage with the curriculum refresh, new *Common Practice Model* for teaching and to be up to date with latest techniques for helping those children needing an extra boost.

Parihaka Day - 5 November

"Turn the other cheek" is a directive that comes from Jesus himself (cf. Mt 5:39; Lk 6:29). It is a 'hard ask'. In the face of injustice what often first comes to mind is retaliation. The people of Parihaka encountered grave injustice. Hostile colonial forces invaded their streets, fields and homes on 5 November 1881. How did they respond?...

Inspired by Scripture and prophetic courage, they decided to 'fight' violence not with more violence but with peace. They turned their cheek, and sang in their streets and offered bread to the invaders. Only faith in God can explain such a conciliatory response. The story of the peaceful resistance of the people of Parihaka is a treasure in the history of Aotearoa New Zealand. "This, the seventh annual World Day of the Poor, is a fruitful sign of the Father's mercy and a support for the lives of our communities. As its celebration becomes more and more rooted in the pastoral life of the Church, it enables us to discover ever anew the heart of the Gospel. Our daily efforts to welcome the poor are still not enough. A great river of poverty is traversing our cities and swelling to the point of overflowing; it seems to overwhelm us, so great are the needs of our brothers and sisters who plead for our help, support and solidarity. For this reason, on the Sunday before the Solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the Universe, we gather around his Table to receive from him once more the gift and strength to live lives of poverty and to serve the poor." 

Messages from the Palmerston North Diocese

Warning - Scam Calls Posing as our Priests

It has come to our attention that scam calls are being made where they have pretended to be one of our diocesan parish priests. Using the priest's name, they ask for help in the form of gift cards or money. Note that none of our priest's will ask for any money or gift cards and if in doubt ring the parish phone number. If you receive any such calls or texts, that are requesting such, please ignore and do not reply. Text's often say, "they are in a meeting, so do not phone, but text back and that your help is critical and highly appreciated". - Do not reply.

You can report their phone number to the Department of Internal Affairs, by forwarding the text to 7726, then send in another text the scammers phone number. Then block the scammer's number immediately. If you receive a text/email which seems strange, always check the phone number (or email address). If it is a scam, the details will be slightly different. If in doubt, please do not respond to the text but delete it. If you have been scammed, it's important that you contact the police on 105.
