Dear Parents, Caregivers and friends of the school.

I would like to start by welcoming the following new tamariki and families who have joined our St John Bosco School Community recently: rumu Koromiko: Craig Smith and his parents Larissa and Daniel, Rowan Speirs and her parents Lydia and Russell and Alfie McFadyen joins his big sister Elodie at school.

You may have heard or read about a number of government policies for education in recent months. With "Phones away for the day" nothing changes for our school. We have always asked that if children need to bring a phone to school for the day that it is handed into the office. The "hour a day" policy is much the same. We maintain a strong academic focus through our structured programmes that include both direct instruction and the integration of reading, writing and maths across all curriculum areas. Those of you fortunate enough to attend Rimu and Karaka's assembly last week will have also seen how they ensured their 'sun safety' unit was also rich in science too, with experiments and data collection about the UV rays in different areas of our school.



#### Easter Sunday Dues Special Collection | 31 March 2024


