
#### May - The Month of Mary

May is the month our Church has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady – Mary. Catholics in every part of the world recognise and celebrate the Queen of Heaven with tributes of faith and love. The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of the Church and therefore the example, as well as the guide and inspiration, of everyone who, in and through the Church, seeks to be the servant of God and man and the obedient agent of the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Some ideas of how you can celebrate and remember Mary in your families are: by talking about her, praying to her, learning the 'Hail Mary' Prayer, and having a picture of Mary on your family Prayer table.



**24th May Our Lady Help of Christians Feast Day** Mary Help of Christians is one of the numerous names by which Mary is known. It refers specifically to the aid that Mary gives as intercession, meaning one who prays with and for us to God. The Mary who helps all Christians - we only need to ask her and she will ask God on our behalf. This is also the Feast day of our church. There will be Rosary at 5pm and Mass at 5:30pm, followed by shared kai. You are all welcome to attend. Please bring a plate of food to share.





#### **RE Learning**

We began Term 2 learning about traditional and devotional prayers, and more about Easter.

Now we are moving into learning about Te Atua - God.

This learning unit focuses on the nature of God as revealed in the scriptures and the Tradition of the Church. It addresses such questions as who, where, what is God and what does God do? It considers each person of the Trinity: God the Father, Jesus and Holy Spirit. It addresses God's relationship with us — individually and collectively, and our relationship with God.

#### The Easter Season is coming to an end....

The Church is still Celebrating the Easter Season as we journey toward Pentecost. The Easter Season began on the evening of Easter Sunday and continues for fifty days, ending on the evening of Pentecost Sunday which is this Sunday. The fifty days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost are a time of thanksgiving and joy for what Christ has done for humanity.

Last Sunday... The Ascension of Jesus.... Ascension Day is celebrated on the 7th Sunday of Easter. On that day people remember how Jesus returned to his father in heaven. The story of Jesus' return to his Father is told in the book of the Acts of the Apostles written by St Luke. St Luke says that as Jesus was lifted up, a cloud hid him from sight. Writers of the Bible sometimes used the idea of a cloud to show that God was present. In his story of the Ascension. St Luke wanted to show that Jesus was going from this world into the presence of God his Father. So people celebrate the Ascension of Jesus as part of the good news of Easter - Jesus is alive, Jesus is with God and with us forever. The Ascension is a day of great joy!



#### This Sunday.... Pentecost... The Birthday of the Church

The week after the Ascension the coming of the Holy Spirit is celebrated on Pentecost Sunday.


Before he returned to his Father in Heaven, while visiting with his disciples, the risen Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit to help them. We read in Scripture that one morning, when the disciples were gathered together with Mary, the mother of Jesus, and some other women, they suddenly heard a noise like a strong wind. Then they saw what looked to be flames of fire over each of them. "And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit."

The Holy Spirit filled the disciples with courage and faith, empowering them to share the Good News with others. They began to tell others about Jesus, and that he died for us and rose to new life. On this day the gift of the Spirit allowed the disciples to communicate even with those who spoke different languages.

We often call this the birthday of the Church because this was when the Holy Spirit was sent to reassure and encourage Jesus' people to not be afraid to carry on and share his good news!




