



### RE LEARNING THIS TERM - Te Rongopai - The Good News

The Good News is really about how God shows who God is to us through the Bible. It's about the relationship between God and people—how much God loves us, and how we can grow closer to God. And the best part? It's genuinely good news—full of hope and joy!



The New Testament shares the story of Jesus and his first followers. The Old Testament tells us about God's connection with the Hebrew people—this is the background that helps us understand Jesus' life and teachings. The Bible is part of all our stories.


But knowing the Bible isn't just for people who are strong in their faith. The Jewish and Christian scriptures have shaped cultures all over the world. We see them echoed in music, art, books, and even laws.

Young people need to get to know the stories and messages in the Bible—but also need help learning how to really understand what they're reading. The New Zealand Catholic Bishops say that the Gospel and moral values are like "seeds of the word" planted in different cultures and societies.

As they grow up, it's important for young people to learn where the Bible comes from and how it was put together. They also need to understand what life was like in the times these stories were written. That way, they can see how these ancient messages still matter and speak to their own lives today.

Then the prophets Moses and Elijah appear next to him and he speaks with them. Jesus is then called "Son" by God the Father. The Transfiguration is one of the five major milestones in the gospels of the life of Jesus, the others are Baptism, Crucifixion, Resurrection, and Ascension.


#### August 8


#### From Gallileo to Laudato Si':
