



THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION FOR OCTOBER 2025

Mark 10:45

For collaboration between different religious traditions:

Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice and human fraternity.

OCTOBER - THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

This year, October gives us four school weeks, which means we will cover all four Mysteries of the Rosary. We will pray the Rosary together in class every day in October next term.

The month of October each year is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. It is based on incidents in the life of Jesus and Mary. The use of beads or knotted ropes to count large numbers of prayers comes from the earliest days of Christianity. However, this way of prayer precedes Christianity. The development of the rosary as we know it today has gone through many stages. Christian Monks used this method to pray the Psalms. Today the rosary consists of in total 150 Hail Marys, divided into three sets of 50, which are further divided into five sets of 10 (a decade). Many people pray 1 set.

The rosary tells the story of Jesus' life in four parts:

The Joyful Mysteries - tell us about Jesus' birth and his early life
The Sorrowful Mysteries - teach us about the suffering and
death of Jesus on the cross

The Glorious Mysteries - are about Jesus' resurrection and the glorious life that awaits us in heaven


The Luminous Mysteries - tell about Jesus' ministry when he went out to teach people about God.

Catholics have been given a very special gift in the rosary. This year we will be praying the Rosary (Joyful, Glorious and Luminous Mysteries) during October. You may also like to make the Rosary part of your prayer time at home next month.

Important Feast Days

St Simon and Saint Jude - 28 October



Saint Simon and Saint Jude were two of the twelve Apostles chosen by Jesus. They were part of the group that followed Him closely and helped spread His teachings. Even though we don't know much about them, they played an important role in the early Church. They were faithful and dedicated to spreading the Gospel.

What is a saint?

A saint is a person, described as a "holy person," who loved God and others and lived a life of faith.

All Saints Day (1st November) and All Souls Day (2nd November)



All Saints Day is a day to celebrate "heavenly friends" and learn about people who were faithful, good, kind, and brave. It's a time to remember and give thanks for all the saints, both the famous ones and those we may not know.

On All Souls' Day the Catholic Church remembers all those who have died - not just the great and the good, but ordinary and especially those loved ones. It reminds us of our connectedness to the faithful and all those special to us, who have died. All of them are honoured by the church.

Attending Mass is important for supporting the RE program in classrooms.


We invite and encourage you to attend our weekday class Masses where possible.

NOVEMBER ~ MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS


During November, many Masses celebrated in the parish, will be prayed for our dead brothers and sisters who as yet do not enjoy the fullness of God's love and joy.




BEREAVEMENT LITURGY
