Religious Education Learning

In Week 1 we began our school year by attending a Liturgy as a whole school to celebrate St John Bosco, our school patron Saint, whose Feast day was on January 31st, before we started school.

We have begun our year establishing classroom prayer routines, and working collaboratively to develop our Class Treaty. We have also been learning about St John Bosco, Euphrasie Barbier and the Mission Sisters who started our school.

We are now moving into the RE Curriculum theme 'A Tātou Whakapapa - Our Story!'

"Our story is the story of the Church, and who we are and how we got here. Our stories as individuals can only be told in the context of whenua, tupuna and whakapapa - the bigger story of our families, our cultures, our faith and our lands.

Children will develop an understanding of the Church in terms of significant events and people that have shaped our Church and the world. They will be able to explore their own whakapapa as well as their communities, connecting with this past, present and future story in which we all belong."

LENT 2026

Lent has begun...

*Lent is preparing ourselves for the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. **The Liturgical Colour is Purple.***
Lent begins with an invitation from God: "Come back to me with all your heart" (Joel 2:12).
Our Lenten Journey is a response to God's invitation.



Last week we began to prepare for Lent by having a Burning of the Palms Liturgy, where we burned palms from Palm Sunday last year, to prepare the ashes for Ash Wednesday Mass .



Then we began Lent together by attending Ash Wednesday Mass as a school this week. Father Simon reminded us that Lent is a time of joy where we prepare ourselves for the greatest Feast and event in our Catholic Calendar.

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. It is the first of the 40 days of Lent leading up to Easter. The 40 days refer to the time Jesus spent in the desert after being baptised in the Jordan by John and before beginning his public ministry.

40 Days of Lent! Significance of 40 In Bible!

Number 40 is mentioned around 146 times in the Holy Bible, it usually is a time of testing, trials, and repentance.

- 40 days during Lent
- 40 days and 40 nights of Great Flood
- Moses is Prince of Egypt for 40 years
- Israelites wander in the forest for 40 years
- Jonah warns people of Nineveh to Repent or be destroyed in 40 Days
- Jesus fasts for 40 days

Interestingly, the word "Lent" comes from Old English through Middle English to modern English. Looking at its origin, "lent" is a shortening of the word "lengthen," used to describe the increasing amount of daylight each day: the harbinger of spring and new life, buds opening, green grass, daffodils, and tulips popping up. Jesus lived in the Northern Hemisphere and therefore the time of Lent and Easter, occurs during their season of Spring This is why we find things relating to Lent and Easter often referring to and making connections to Spring.

Spring for many is a time of cleaning, and Lent is a time for spiritual spring cleaning. We clean out the clutter that has accumulated in our lives to make more room for God and one another.

We will be exploring the Caritas Lenten Resources each week during Lent. We are invited to listen to God's voice and the voices of the vulnerable, and to respond with love and action.

Using the three traditional pillars - prayer, fasting, and almsgiving we will be connecting our faith to real world justice. Lent becomes a time of transformation where we can reflect on our responsibilities as Christians, and discover how to be God's love in action.

Each week of Lent pairs Gospel readings from Christ's journey with contemporary stories from Caritas partners worldwide. Students will encounter communities across the Pacific (Fiji, Papua New Guinea, Tonga, West Papua and Samoa) and beyond (Kenya and the Holy Land), seeing firsthand how Caritas walks alongside people working to overcome poverty and injustice. vulnerable, and to respond with love and action.

Later this term we will be participating in the Caritas Lenten Challenge.

The Caritas challenge is an annual event which gives children the opportunity to demonstrate solidarity with those living in poverty or injustice.

In 2026, we are supporting vulnerable communities impacted by climate change through the He Oranga Taurikura programme.

Together, we can help families adapt and thrive in the face of environmental challenges.





Wednesday 25 March 6.30-8:00pm. For children and families to be part of the sacramental programmes, it will be very important for a parent or care giver to be at this meeting.



Parents and caregivers can place orders using the **Kindo app** (available on iPhone and Android) and choose from a range of convenient payment options, including card, bank transfer, Google Pay, Apple Pay, and more. The system also includes helpful allergen alerts and automated reminders, helping ensure no one misses out on lunch day.






