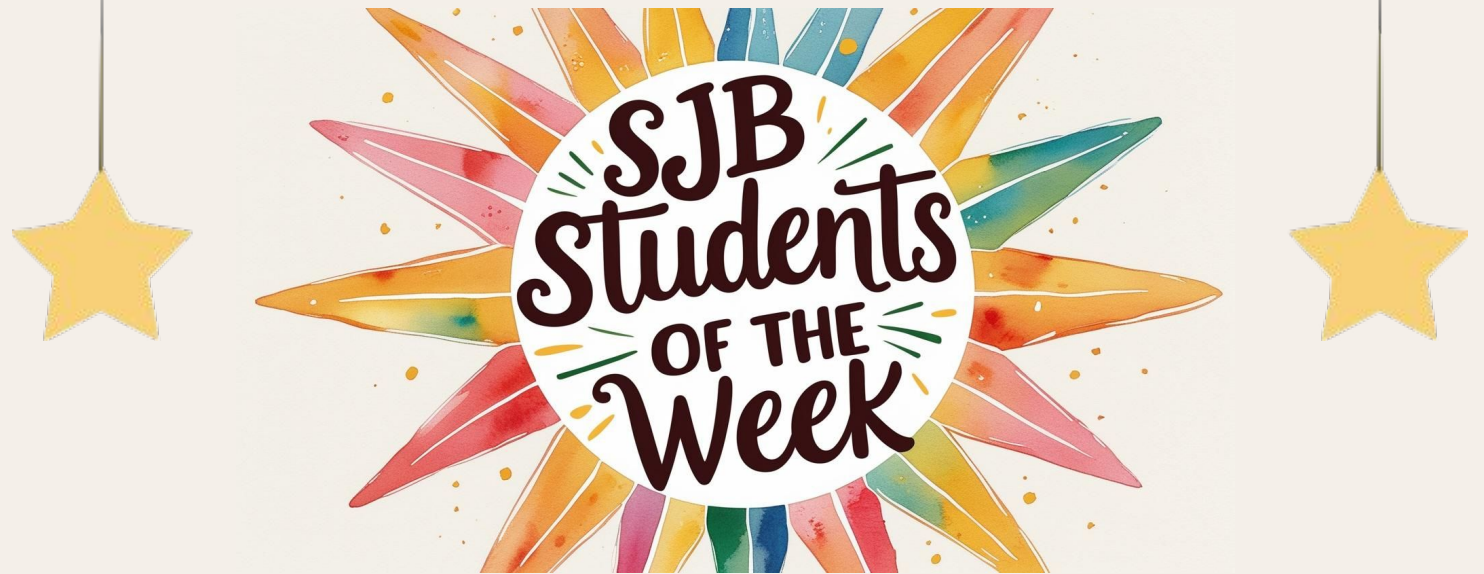

THE POPE'S PRAYER INTENTION for April 2026 For priests in crisis:

Let us pray for priests going through moments of crisis in their vocation, that they may find the accompaniment they need and that communities may support them with understanding and prayer.

What is Holy Week?

Holy Week is the special week before Easter that tells the story of Jesus' last days on earth. It began last Sunday - Palm Sunday, where we celebrated Jesus' triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. He was welcomed by crowds worshipping him and laying down palm leaves before him. It also marks the beginning of Holy Week. He then spent time with the Gentiles in the Temple, and on Wednesday left for the Mount of Olives. He returned to Jerusalem on Thursday, to share the Last Supper with His apostles. Then was then arrested and tried. He was crucified at Calvary on Friday. He was buried the same day, and arose three days later, on Easter Sunday.



Note: *Easter is not part of Holy Week, but rather the beginning of the Easter season.*

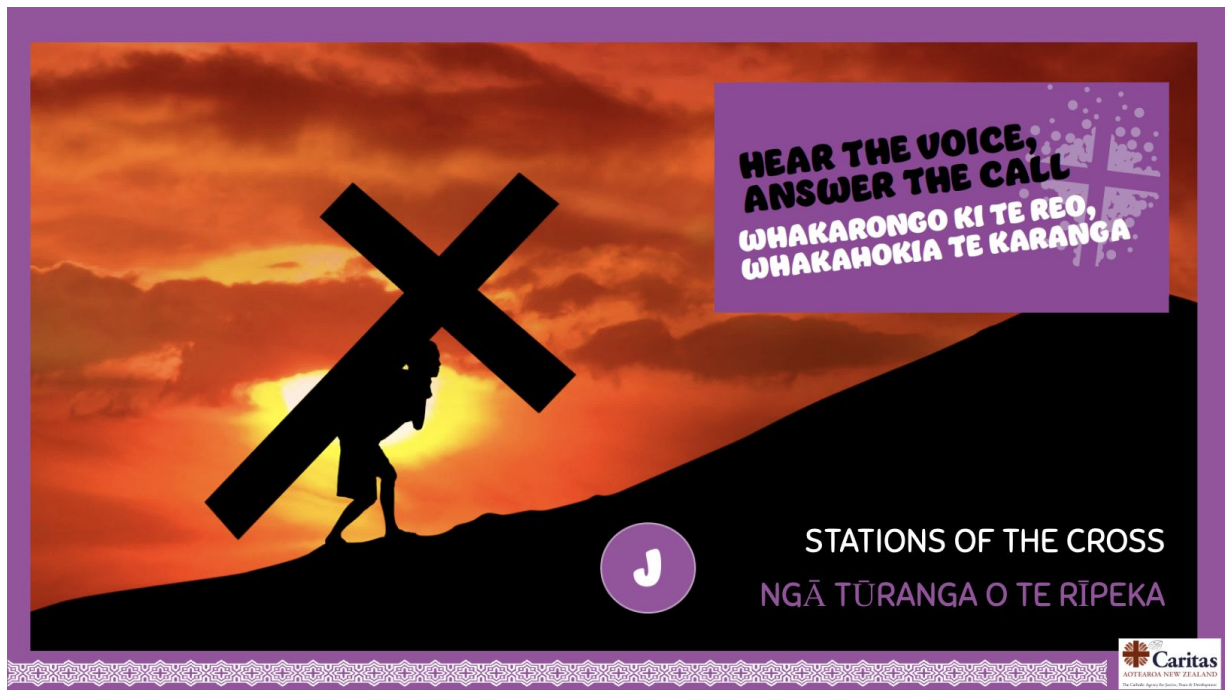

The Stations of the Cross

The Stations of the Cross is about Jesus's painful walk to crucifixion using 14 simple, visual steps. Also known as the Way of the Cross or the Way of Sorrows and are any series of fourteen images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion with accompanying scripture and prayers. The stations help Christians to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. It has become one of the most popular devotions and the stations can be prayed in many Christian churches, including Catholic, Lutheran, Anglican and Methodist.



This week, our school gathered in the church over three afternoons to pray the Stations of the Cross. We used the Caritas resource, which aligned with the Lenten programme and helped us make meaningful connections between each station and real-life stories from around the world.

These reflections invited us to think deeply about the experiences of others and to pray for people facing injustice, hardship, and poverty. It was a special time of prayer, compassion, and reflection for our students and staff as we journey through Lent together.

During our **LIVE-A-THON** day, children had a little bit of an experience of what life is like for the children living in these countries who have to make shelters with limited resources, and eat only rice or simple foods.

This year, Caritas will use the money raised to support vulnerable communities impacted by climate change through the He Oranga Taurikura programme. The NZ Aid Foundation gives \$3 for every \$1 donated to this event.

Thank you so much St John Bosco School Community, for your support and generous donations. Together we have raised \$3,683.20, \$497.30 of that was today with the Easter Market. This amount will be a total of \$14,732.80 for Caritas this year. God bless you all.





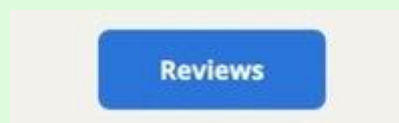
