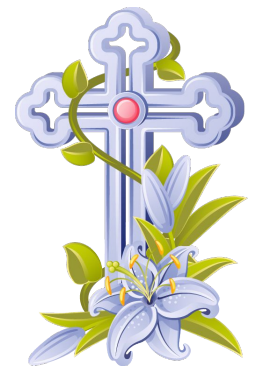

More about the Easter Season: The Church is still Celebrating the Easter Season as we journey toward Pentecost. The Easter Season begins on the evening of Easter Sunday and continues for fifty days, ending on the evening of Pentecost Sunday. The fifty days between Easter Sunday and Pentecost is a time of thanksgiving and joy for what Christ has done for humanity.



Honoring Mary in the Month of May:

Why May? In the Catholic Church, the month of May is traditionally dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. While the Northern Hemisphere celebrates this in spring, here in **Aotearoa**, we honor Mary as the autumn leaves fall. Even as the days get shorter and cooler, Mary's love provides a "spiritual warmth" for our families.

A Little History The Feast of Our Lady, Help of Christians, which is celebrated on May 24, dates back to the sixteenth century, which was not a peaceful time in Europe. In 1571, Catholics throughout the continent joined in praying the rosary in hope for peace.

When the early missionaries and settlers arrived in New Zealand, they brought this deep love for Mary with them. In 1841, Bishop Pompallier even dedicated our country to **Mary, Help of Christians**. So, when we celebrate Mary in May, we are continuing a long history of faith that belongs right here in our own backyard. This day is just as important today. A special time to ask Mary to help us all in our prayer for peace.

Ways to Celebrate this Month

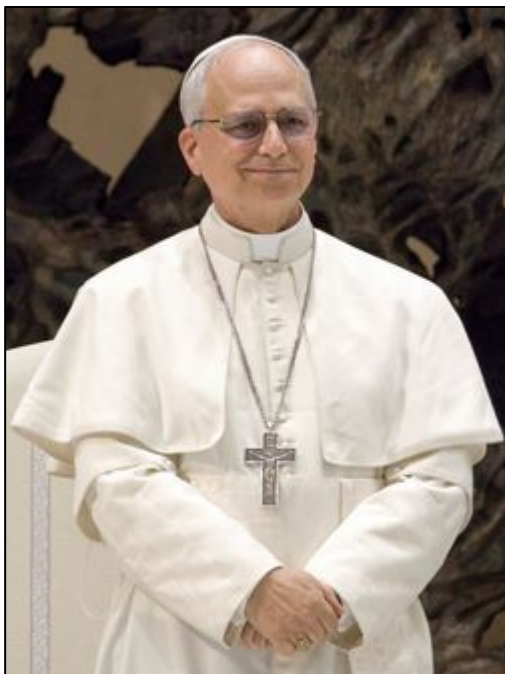

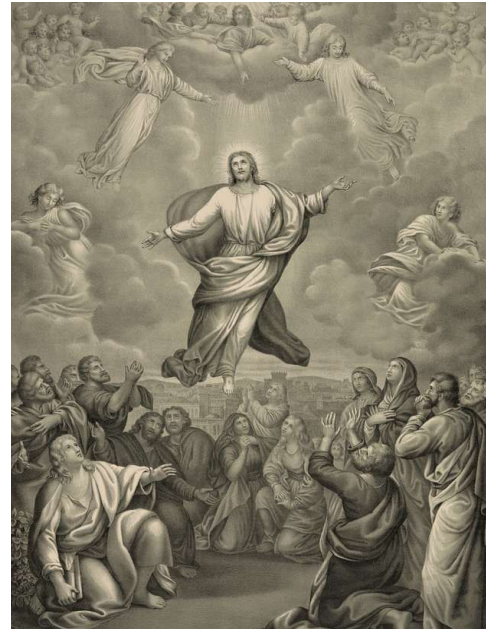


17th May - ASCENSION of the LORD

What is the Ascension? For 40 days after his resurrection on Easter Sunday, the Bible says that Jesus travelled and preached with his apostles, preparing them for his departure from Earth. Ascension Day marks the moment Jesus literally ascended into heaven before his disciples, at the village of Bethany, near Jerusalem.

13th May - Our Lady of Fatima

The story of Our Lady of Fatima began in 1917 in a small village in Portugal, where three young shepherd children—Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta—reported seeing a beautiful lady "brighter than the sun". She appeared to them six times between May and October, always on the 13th day of the month, sharing messages of prayer and hope for the world. The Lady, who later identified herself as the **Lady of the Rosary**, had a very clear message for the children and the world. Pray the Rosary for peace in the world.



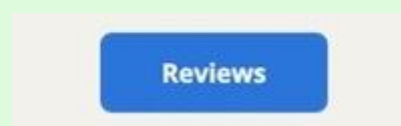

Rental Prices:

Girls: White dress \$10, white shoes \$5, white jackets/cardigans \$5, shoulder or waist length veils \$5 (only if really wanted for First Communion), ribbons or clips in hair look just as nice – I have a small selection in stock

Boys: Black Trousers \$5, white shirts (with or without tie) \$5, vests/waistcoats \$5 (black or white)

How To Rent:

Ring from approximately 6 weeks out and arrange an appointment for your child/children to come and have a look and try on. If you decide to rent then you can normally take the garment with you on that day, keep it safe, wear it on the day, then return it to me by the Friday following the event. 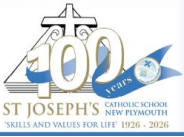

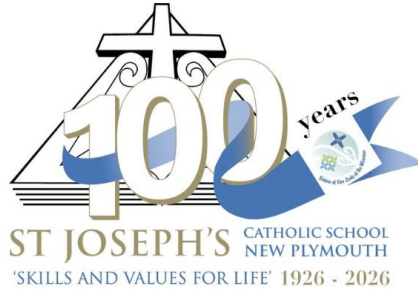
